Purpose of the Report

- By way of introduction, to provide context to the 15 minute presentation of outcomes by six voluntary sector organisations, funded by the Council in 2013/14.
- To note any comments from Members to inform future commissioning arrangements.

1 Report Details

- 1.1 At Minute No. 186 (2013/14), Cabinet approved new commissioning and monitoring arrangements following a review of funding to voluntary and community sector organisations, in accordance with the Shaping The Future ("Total Council") Approach.
- 1.2 In accordance with Service Level Agreement monitoring arrangements, a data collection exercise is supplemented by a requirement for each funding recipient to present their outcomes to Cabinet/Council. This will provide a unique opportunity for interface between the two sectors to ensure the voluntary organisations support the Council to provide good value, high performing services and particularly to support vulnerable and disadvantaged people in our localities, in accordance with Corporate Objectives.
- 1.3 The following six organisations have been invited to attend separate meetings scheduled in a tight window of opportunity in accordance with the new commissioning cycle:

Derbyshire Law Centre - Cabinet on 30th July Derbyshire Unemployed Workers Centre/TRUST – Cabinet on 27th August NED Citizens Advice Bureau – Council on 1st September Links CVS – Cabinet on 24th September Rural Action Derbyshire – Council on 27th October

- 1.4 The presentations will provide an insight of our continued efforts in partnership to keep abreast of emerging issues and targeting appropriate services in accordance with needs in our localities. Members will be invited to ask questions following the presentation.
- 1.5 The presentations will be supplemented in October/November by an Annual Report compiled by the Partnership Team of a full range of projects in accordance with the Shaping The Future Approach, so Members have a greater understanding of how our partnership approaches are responding to the latest challenges faced in our communities.

2 Conclusions and Reasons for Recommendation

- 2.1 Members are asked to note the content of the presentations and any comments will be collated to inform the Annual Report and future commissioning recommendations.
- 2.2 To ensure that the Council maximises efficiencies and outcomes through commissioning voluntary sector organisations to help us achieve our Corporate Priorities.
