Purpose of the Report

• To advise Cabinet of a recommendation from the Disabled People's Joint Consultative Group.

1 Report Details

- 1.1 The Disabled People's Joint Consultative Group is a working group of the Council comprising members, officers and representatives of local disabled people's groups in the District. Its purpose is to advise the Council on matters affecting disabled people in the District.
- 1.2 On 11 March 2015 the Group put forward the following recommendation to Cabinet:

Ensure that we continue to have a permanent presence in Chesterfield Town Centre to ensure the most vulnerable people in North East Derbyshire can pay bills and seek advice in a central position in the area.

1.3 This was considered at Cabinet on 15 April 2015 which resolved:

That whenever there is a proven need for the District Council to have a presence in Chesterfield Town Centre in the future, Cabinet will give the matter careful consideration.

1.4 Cabinet's resolution was reported back to the Group on 1 July 2015. The minutes from that meeting, attached at **Appendix 1**, show that the Group wished to refer the recommendation back to Cabinet for further consideration.

A slightly modified recommendation from the Group was as follows:

To keep a presence permanently in Chesterfield to ensure the most vulnerable in North East Derbyshire can pay benefits/council tax in a central position.

2 Conclusions and Reasons for Recommendation

2.1 Officers have noted the Group's reiterated request for a permanent office in Chesterfield town centre although no evidence of proven need has yet been put forward. It should be recognised that this issue relates to a wider issue relating to the future of the Saltergate site and will be considered at the appropriate time. Any decision to retain a presence in Chesterfield would need to be taken having regard to evidence of existing and likely future level of demand.
