**Funding to Voluntary and Community Organisations – Presentation of Outcomes for 2016/17**

**Purpose of the Report**

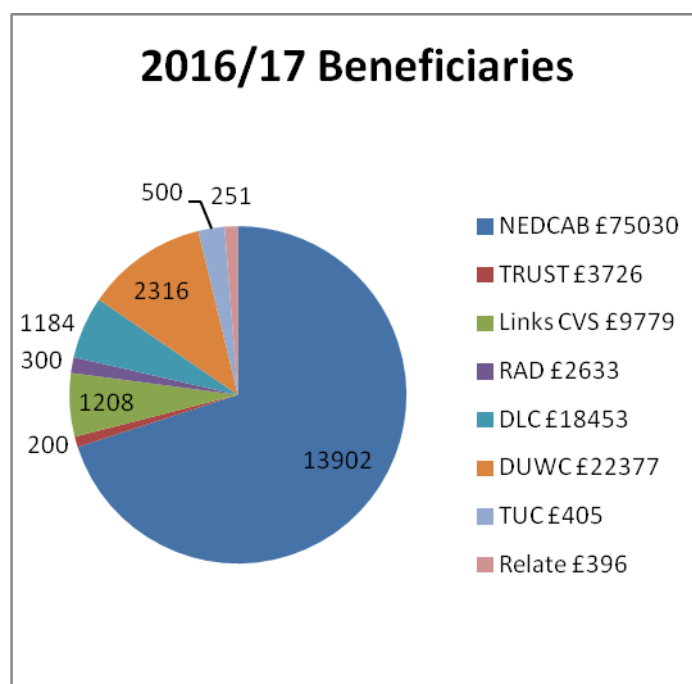
- By way of introduction, to provide context to the 15 minute presentation of outcomes by five voluntary sector organisations, funded by the Council in 2016/17.
- To note any comments from Members to inform future commissioning arrangements.

**1 Report Details**

- 1.1 At Minute No. 186 (2013/14), Cabinet approved new commissioning and monitoring arrangements following a review of funding to voluntary and community sector organisations. For the last two years, members have received a series of informative presentations from voluntary groups and it was agreed that this process be continued.
- 1.2 In accordance with Service Level Agreement monitoring arrangements, a data collection exercise is supplemented by a requirement for each funding recipient to present their outcomes to Cabinet/Council. This now provides a yearly opportunity for active engagement with (voluntary sector) partners to benefit our communities in accordance with Corporate Aims to “Transform our Organisation”, to “Provide our Customers with Excellent Service” by supporting vulnerable and disadvantaged people and contributing to improving health and wellbeing (“Supporting our Communities to be Healthier, Safer, Cleaner and Greener”).
- 1.3 Investment in these voluntary organisations is measured in accordance with the Corporate Plan 2015-19 target to assist over 13,000 vulnerable and disadvantaged households year on year. This baseline was established following the presentations and year end monitoring exercise conducted in 2014/15. The following table shows the Council’s overall investment and the number of vulnerable and disadvantaged households assisted since the target baseline was set:

| Council Investment |          | Vulnerable and disadvantaged households assisted |
|--------------------|----------|--|
| 2014/15            | £131,312 | 13,565   |
| 2015/16            | £132,799 | 18,319   |
| 2016/17            | £132,799 | 19,861   |

The monitoring exercise has consistently shown an increase in customer demand for these services and the Council can be reassured that its investment is targeting services to people in crisis and when it is needed the most for roughly under £10 per vulnerable household in 2014/15, £7 per household in 2015/16 and £6.70 per household in 2016/17 (latest figures). The data collected helps to highlight an increase in demand on specific issues, and services from specific communities, enabling the identification of 'hot-spot' areas within the District. Organisations will report further on the context of the increase in demand for services at their presentations.



- 1.4 The Council has again decided to maintain current levels of funding for 2017/18 in spite of budgetary constraints, in return for the maintenance of current levels of activity by the funded organisations in our District. It is known that neighbouring authorities made decisions to reduce voluntary sector core funding by at least 10% for 2016/17. Organisations will inform Cabinet as part of their presentation of the latest position regarding any proposed funding implications following the County Council election in May 2017.
- 1.5 The following five organisations have been invited to attend separate Cabinet meetings scheduled in accordance with the commissioning cycle:

Derbyshire Law Centre – 28<sup>th</sup> June

North East Derbyshire Citizens' Advice Bureau – 2<sup>nd</sup> August  
Rural Action Derbyshire – 30<sup>th</sup> August  
Links CVS – 27<sup>th</sup> September  
Derbyshire Unemployed Workers Centre – 25<sup>th</sup> October

- 1.6 The presentations will provide an insight of our continued efforts in partnership to keep abreast of emerging issues and targeting appropriate services in accordance with needs in our localities. Members will be invited to ask questions following the presentation.

## **2 Conclusions and Reasons for Recommendation**

- 2.1 Members are asked to note the content of the presentations and any comments will be collated to inform future commissioning recommendations.
- 2.3 To ensure that the Council maximises efficiencies and outcomes through commissioning voluntary sector organisations to help us achieve our Corporate Priorities.
