Purpose of the Report

- By way of introduction, to provide context to the 15 minute presentation of outcomes by one of five voluntary sector organisations, funded by the Council in 2014/15.
- To note any comments from Members to inform future commissioning arrangements.

1 Report Details

- 1.1 At Minute No. 186 (2013/14), Cabinet approved new commissioning and monitoring arrangements following a review of funding to voluntary and community sector organisations, in accordance with the Shaping The Future ("Total Council") Approach. Last year members received a series of informative presentations from voluntary groups and it was agreed that this process be continued.
- 1.2 In accordance with Service Level Agreement monitoring arrangements, a data collection exercise is supplemented by a requirement for each funding recipient to present their outcomes to Cabinet/Council. This now provides a yearly opportunity for active engagement with (voluntary sector) partners to benefit our communities in accordance with Corporate Aims to "Transform our Organisation", to "Provide our Customers with Excellent Service" by supporting vulnerable and disadvantaged people and contributing to improving health and wellbeing ("Supporting our Communities to be Healthier, Safer, Cleaner and Greener").
- 1.3 Investment in these voluntary organisations is now measured in accordance with the new Corporate Plan 2015-19 target to assist over 13,000 vulnerable and disadvantaged households year on year. This baseline was established following the presentations and year end monitoring exercise conducted last year.
- 1.4 The following five organisations have been invited to attend separate meetings scheduled in accordance with the commissioning cycle:

Derbyshire Unemployed Workers Centre – Council on 13th July Links CVS – Cabinet on 5th August NED Citizens Advice Bureau – Cabinet on 2nd September Rural Action Derbyshire – Cabinet on 30th September Derbyshire Law Centre - Council on 2nd November

1.5 The presentations will provide an insight of our continued efforts in partnership to keep abreast of emerging issues and targeting appropriate services in accordance with needs in our localities. Members will be invited to ask questions following the presentation.

- 2.1 Members are asked to note the content of the presentations and any comments will be collated to inform future commissioning recommendations.
- 2.3 To ensure that the Council maximises efficiencies and outcomes through commissioning voluntary sector organisations to help us achieve our Corporate Priorities.
