Purpose of the Report

• To advise Committee of a recent report by the Committee on Standards in Public Life around ethical standards for providers of public services.

1 Report Details

- 1.1 When Lord Nolan published the First Report of the Committee on Standards in Public Life in 1995 he not only set out the Seven Principles of Public Life but also three 'common threads' for ensuring that those Principles were properly understood and followed Codes of Conduct, Independent Scrutiny, and Guidance and Education. Lord Nolan was clear that an essential part of the necessary guidance and education on ethical standards was induction training.
- 1.2 This report revisits the subject of ethics in induction. The Committee notes good practice, highlights areas where standards are at risk, and identifies where improvements could be made to embed ethical standards more effectively. The Committee draws on a survey of local authorities' approaches to induction and training and commissioned a paper from Professor Mark Philp on the subject of ethics in practice for politicians Public Ethics and Political Judgment.
- 1.3 From the evidence assessed by the Committee, induction is an effective means of heightening that awareness and building a real understanding of what the Seven Principles of Public Life and codes of conduct mean in practice. Leadership is crucial to the effectiveness of induction processes.
- 1.4 It is the Committee's conclusion that induction is essential to ensure that public office holders are aware of the standards expected of them and therefore that ethical standards need to be included in the induction arrangements for all those public life.
