Clay Cross Town Deal Background

Clay Cross is one of a number of towns up and down the country that were invited to submit a Town Investment Plan to gain Government funding through the Town Deal process. As part of this, Clay Cross has been allocated £24.1m of funding to undertake a number of projects which are identified in the Clay Cross Investment Plan. These projects are:

Low Carbon Workspace

Low Carbon Housing

Low Carbon Energy Network Strategy

Purpose of the Working Group

The Clay Cross Creative project will act as a focal point to the delivery of creative enterprise, arts and social programmes with a focus on engaging the community, including young people, around creative, artisan and social enterprise. It is intended that Clay Cross Creative will be the base for First Art, a creative community charity, part of the Creative People and Places network funded by the Arts Council England.

The project will provide:

- The refurbishment of three local heritage assets in the heart of the town centre;
- Offices and workspace for First Art;
- Workshop and touchdown space for makers, artists and other small businesses
- A 'pop up' retail environment for local makers
- · A gallery space and garden space
- Artisan work shed for creative makers

- Access to creative and making equipment including screen printing, desk-top publishing and printing and a digital printer
- A base for an events programme including training, business coaching, social and networking events

Outputs and Outcomes

The Clay Cross Town Board has committed to the delivery of a number of outputs and outcomes for the project:

Re-use of Historical Building = 1

Jobs Created = 34

Creation of Shared Workspace = 1,200sqm

Number of visitors to arts, cultural and heritage events and venues = 15,000

Number of visitors to arts, cultural and heritage events and venues = 20

Number of start-ups and/or scaleups utilising business incubation, acceleration and co-working spaces = 10

In addition to the delivery and monitoring of the above outputs and outcomes, the group will specifically:

- Oversee the preparation of detailed business cases for the Clay Cross Creative project as identified in the Clay Cross Town Investment Plan
- Steer the final business cases through the Local Assurance Framework
- Work with Amion to develop the scope of the project and provide technical information necessary for the production of the business cases.
- Commission directly, or work with private sector partners to procure, the preparation of planning applications and all other permissions required for development
- Explore all opportunities for match funding from other public sources
- Identify manage and report key risks associated with the project
- Consult with and obtain all necessary approvals from the parent organisation as required e.g. Cabinet or Full Council
- Align their work programme with Amion's workplan to ensure all necessary tasks are completed on time when required to support the production of the individual business cases
- Work to develop any tender briefs etc required for appointing any developers and/or consultants
- Work closely with the appointed developers and their sub-contractors etc to ensure the smooth delivery of the project
- Report progress to the Clay Cross Town Board on a monthly basis within a template format agreed by the Board
- Liaise with the Communication and Community Working Group to ensure a regular flow of publicity and, where necessary, consultation
