## **REPORT DETAILS**

### **1 Background**

- 1.1 The Public Sector Internal Audit Standards require that the Head of the Internal Audit Consortium reports periodically to the Audit and Corporate Governance Scrutiny Committee in respect of performance against the audit plan. Significant risk and control issues should also be reported.

### **2. Details of Proposal or Information**

- 2.1 Appendix 1 is a summary of reports issued in September and October 2022 in respect of the 2022/23 financial year. The Appendix shows for each report the level of assurance given and the number of recommendations made / agreed where a full response has been received. This provides an overall assessment of the system's ability to meet its objectives and manage risk. The definitions of the assurance levels used can be seen at Appendix 2.
- 2.2 In this period 3 reports have been issued 2 with substantial assurance and 1 with reasonable assurance.
- 2.3 No issues arising relating to fraud were identified.
- 2.4 Appendix 3 provides full details of the audits completed and those in progress. Given the recruitment difficulties faced by the Consortium it is considered that good progress is being made on the plan.
- 2.5 Senior Auditor interviews were held on the 26<sup>th</sup> October and both the vacant NEDDC Senior Auditor post and the upcoming vacant BDC Senior Auditor post have been successfully filled. The NEDDC post was filled by an internal applicant so the process of appointing an Auditor has commenced.
