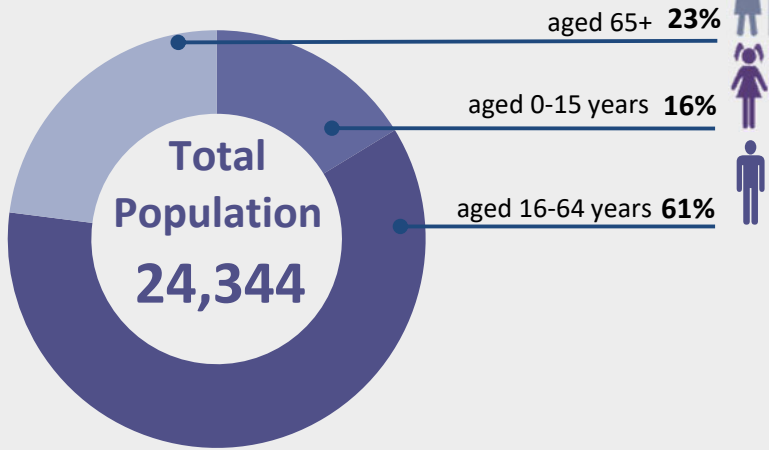
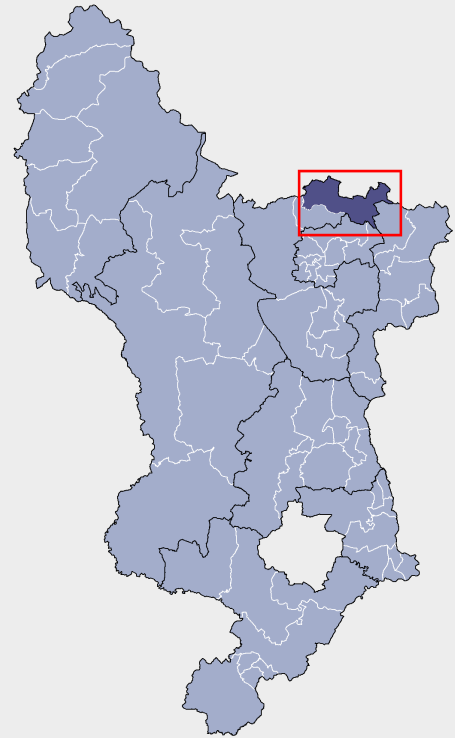


2021 Area Summary Profile Eckington and Killamarsh Electoral Division

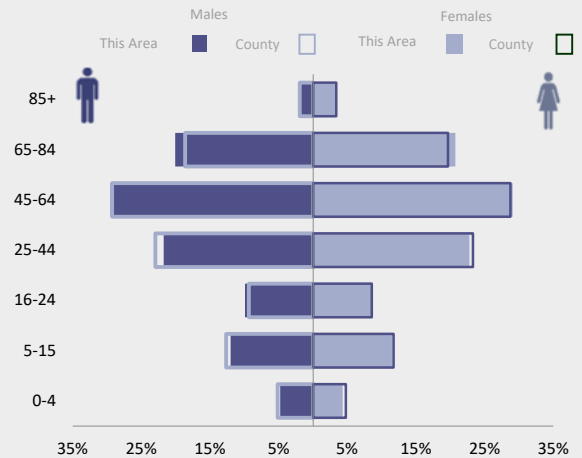

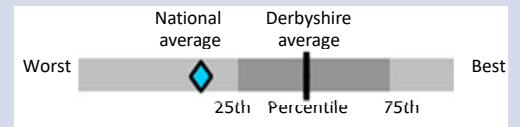
