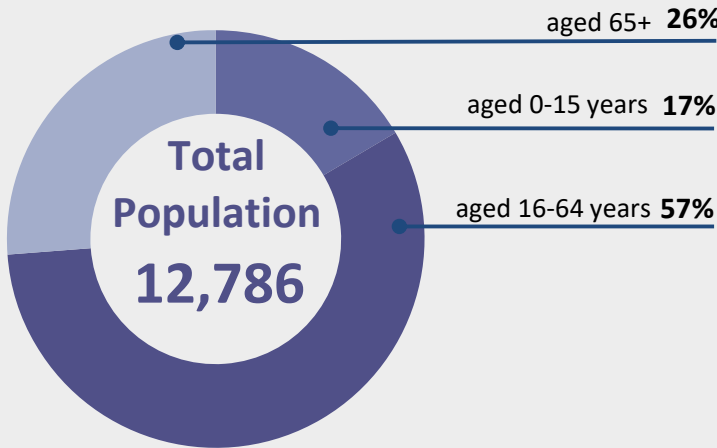
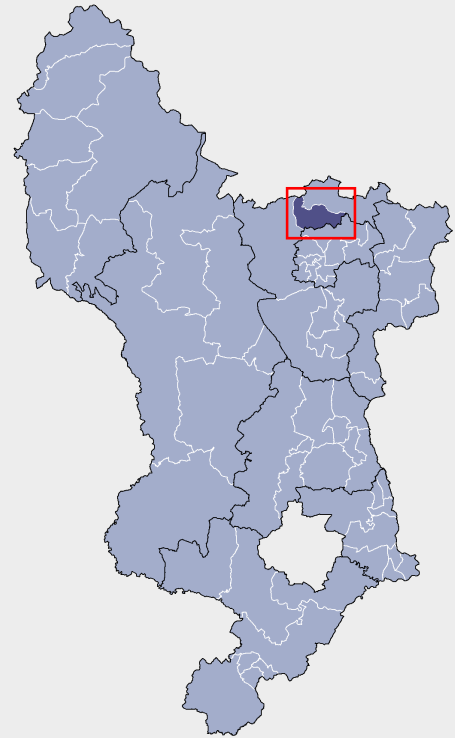


2021 Area Summary Profile Dronfield East Electoral Division

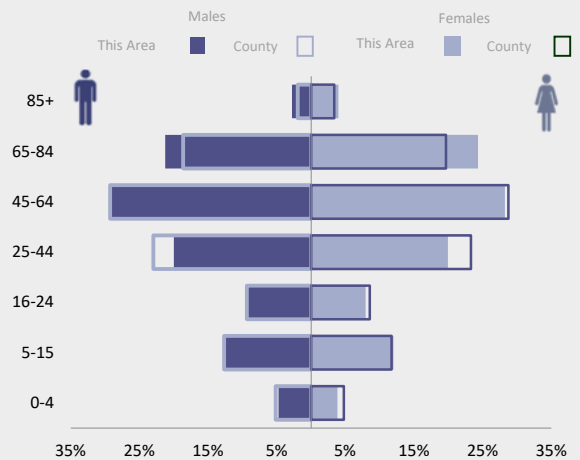

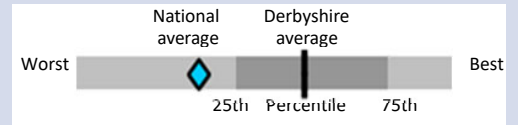

The chart below compares a range of indicators for Derbyshire.
