REPORT DETAILS

- **Background** (reasons for bringing the report)
- 1.1 Under the Licensing Act 2003 ('the Act'), North East Derbyshire District Council ('the Council') is responsible for the administration and regulation of licences and certificates which authorise the following activities:
 - The sale and supply of alcohol;
 - The provision of regulated entertainment; and
 - The provision of late night refreshment.
- 1.2 The Act contains four licensing objectives which are central to the regulatory regime created by the Act, and are:
 - The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
 - The Prevention of Public Nuisance
 - The Protection of Children from Harm
 - Public Safety

When discharging its functions, the Council, as a statutory Licensing Authority, must make decisions with a view to promoting these objectives.

- 1.3 The Licensing Act 2003 imposes a statutory requirement upon the Council, to prepare and publish a Statement of Principles (alternatively referred to as a 'Policy') every five years.
- 1.4 In 2018 a review was undertaken to ensure that the Council's Policy was consistent with statutory guidance and in a format common to neighbouring authorities to enable consistency and transparency. The Act requires the Council to republish its Policy every five years. The current Policy was published in 2019 and is now due for renewal.
- 1.5 The Policy establishes a set of controls which the Council considers appropriate for the effective management of licensable activities within the district. The Policy acts as a guide for Members, applicants, responsible authorities, and members of the public and aims to promote fair, consistent, and proportionate decision making.

2 <u>Details of Proposal or Information</u>

2.1 The Joint Environmental Health Service conducted an initial review of the Policy and identified a number of amendments necessary to bring the policy up to date.

- 2.2 In summary the proposed amendments aimed to achieve the following:
 - Ensure the Policy is consistent with legislation and statutory guidance
 - Increase the clarity of the Policy
 - Improve the standards of premises in the district through the recommendation of more robust management practices
 - Provide clarity on delegations; and
 - Update local demographics.
- 2.3 Following consideration of the draft policy through the Licensing and Gambling Acts Committee, a six-week public consultation opened between 26th February 2024 and 7th April 2024.
- 2.4 The Consultation was carried out through the Ask Derbyshire website and publicised via the Council's website and social media platforms. A number of stakeholders were also contacted directly via email or letter. A full list of stakeholders consulted can be found at **Appendix 1.**
- 2.5 The Licensing Section received one response to the consultation. A copy of that response is attached as **Appendix 2** and raised the following concerns:

apply to all ages and genders.	crime in the district. Those sections of the Policy have therefore been included to address locally identified areas of concern. The Policy also contains provisions which are more generic in nature to promote the licensing objectives in relation to all individuals not just women and girls.

- 2.6 Despite carrying out an extensive consultation exercise, the Council did not receive any further responses to the consultation.
- 2.7 This lack of response likely indicates an indifference to the proposed changes to the Policy and that the updated Policy is fit for purpose.

Updates Following Consultation

- 2.8 Following the consultation, minor amendments have been made to the Policy to insert the dates the Policy will remain in force and a list of persons consulted in the preparation of the Policy. A copy of the updated draft Policy can be found attached as **Appendix 3.**
- 2.9 An Equality Impact Assessment has been conducted in line with the Council's Equality and Diversity Policy.

2.10 Following approval of a final draft Policy by the Licensing and Gambling Acts Committee, a further report will be submitted to Council with a recommendation that the Policy be formally adopted.

3 Reasons for Recommendation

3.1 The Council has a statutory duty to prepare and publish a Statement of Principles under the Licensing Act 2003 every five years.

4 Alternative Options and Reasons for Rejection

4.1 The Council can choose not to prepare and publish a new Statement of Principles under the Licensing Act 2003; however, this would leave the Authority open to legal challenges by way of appeals against decisions on licensing matters or judicial review.
